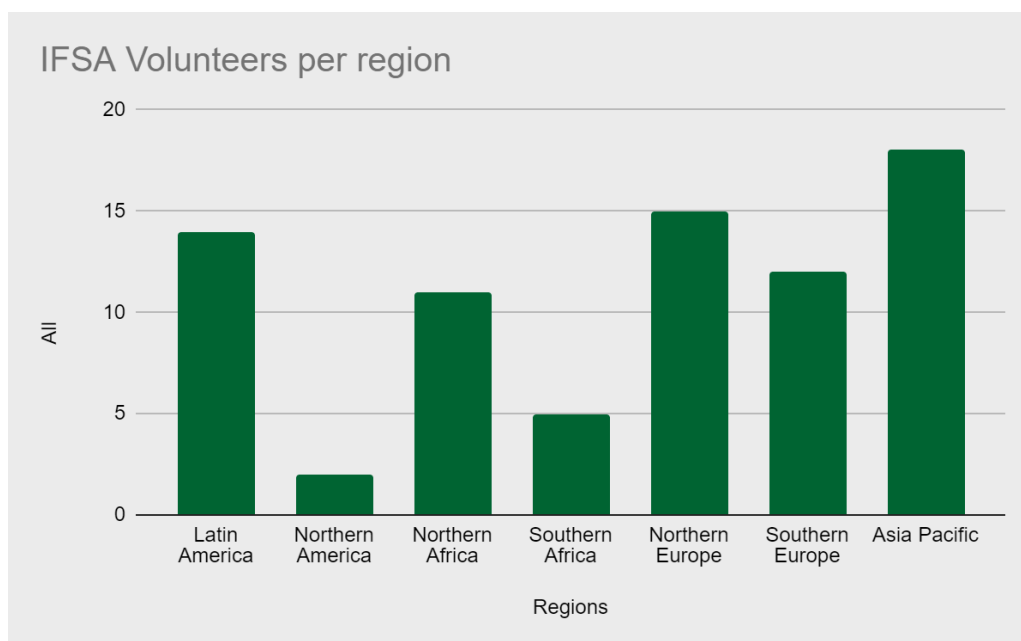

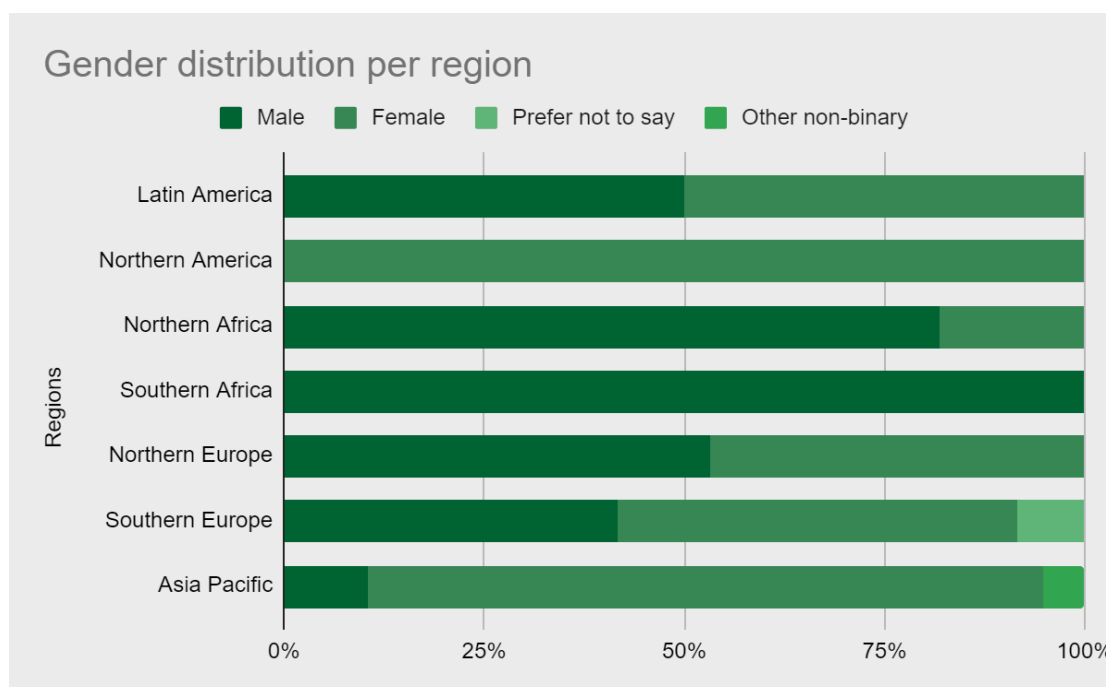
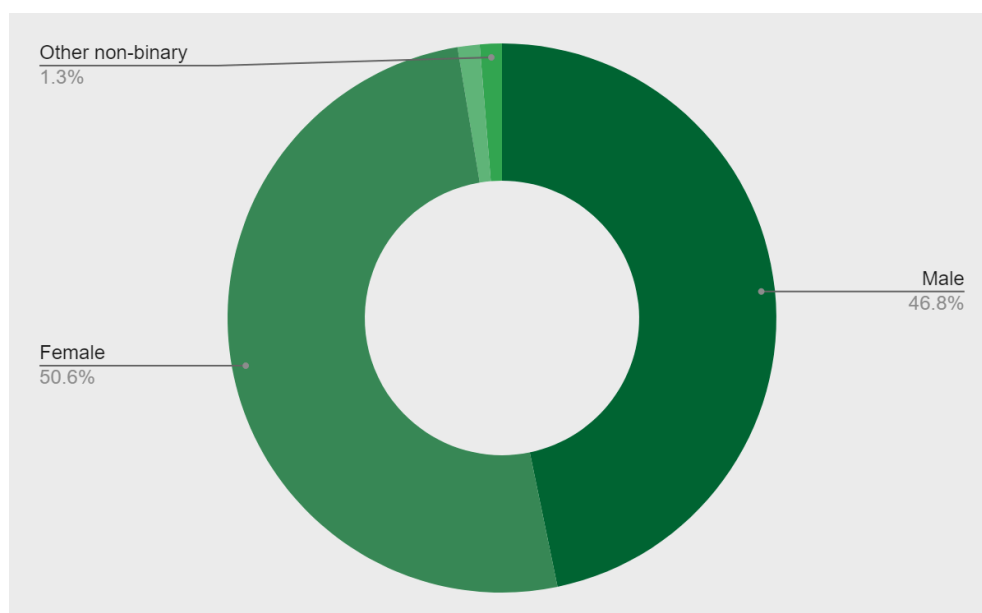
IFSA Volunteers

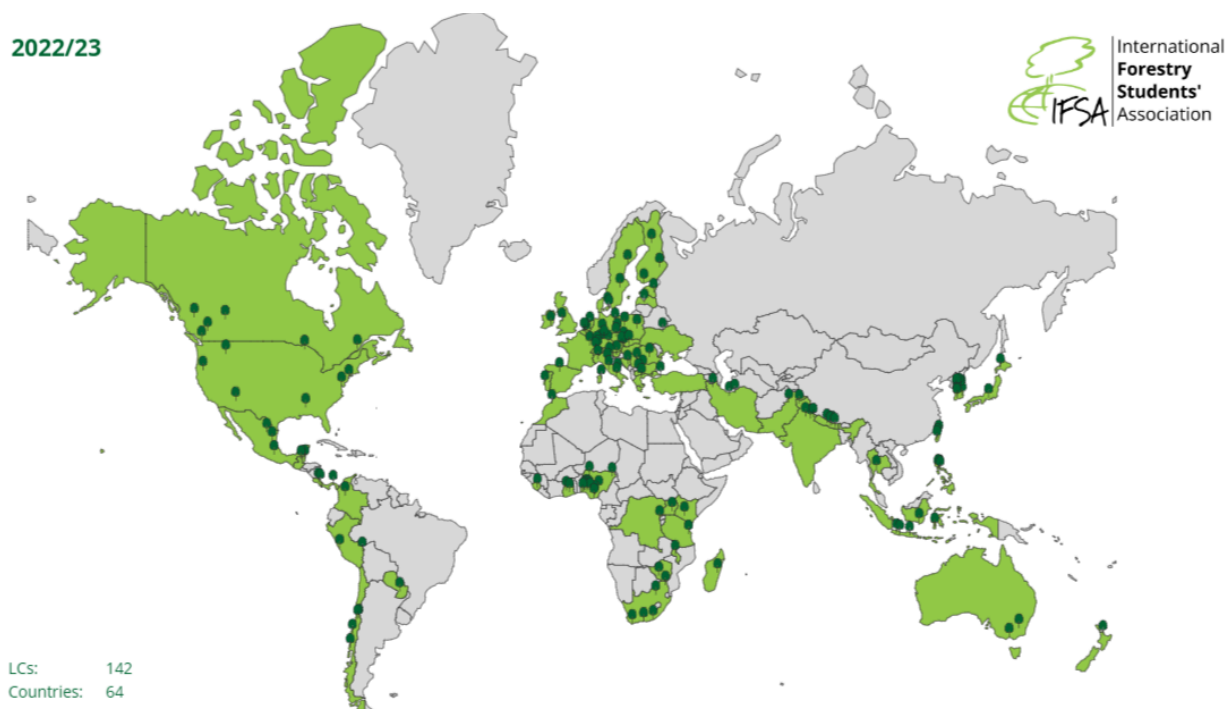

LC data collection

General description

Between April and May 2023, for the second consecutive year the Membership Department has collected some demographic information from our LCs. In total, 94 from 140 LCs that IFSA had in those months answered the survey, which makes 67.1% (the year before it was 81.5%). The missing information was extrapolated based on this.

Results

The results show that there are 11,636 IFSA members in total, which is 10 more than the previous year's results which is not statistically significant. Same as the previous year, the

highest share of members are located in the Northern African region (47%), followed by Asia Pacific (13.2%), Northern Europe (11.1%), Southern Europe (10.9%), Southern Africa (10.7%), Latin America (3.7%) and Northern America (3.4%).

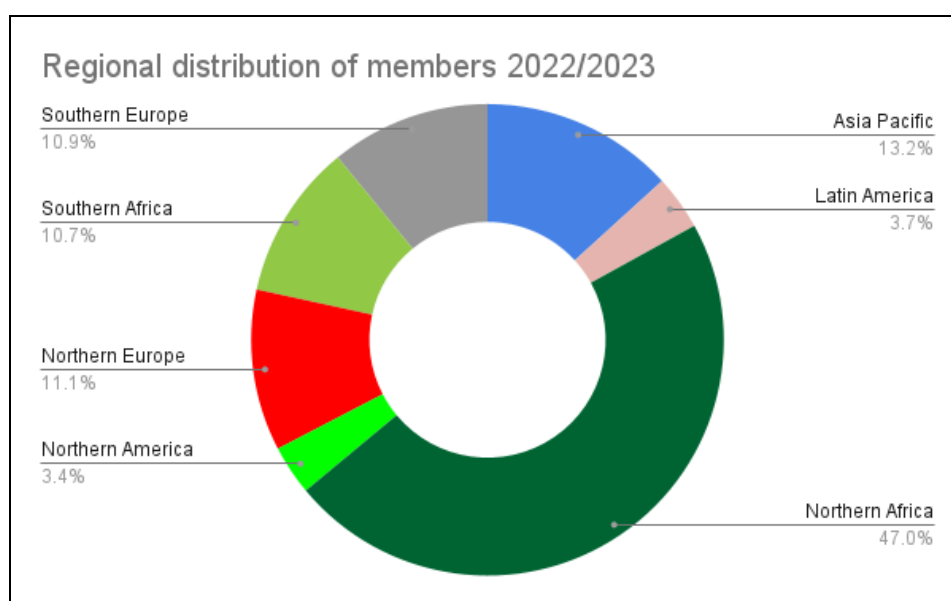
The share of male-female ratio stays very similar, without statistically significant differences, while there is a decrease of the gender category 'Prefer not to say' (from 3.8% in 2021/22 to 0.7% in 2022/23).

There are 8.1% more passive members (52.6%) than the previous term (43.5%) which are those members that are officially part of the LC but join less than 2 LC activities per year.

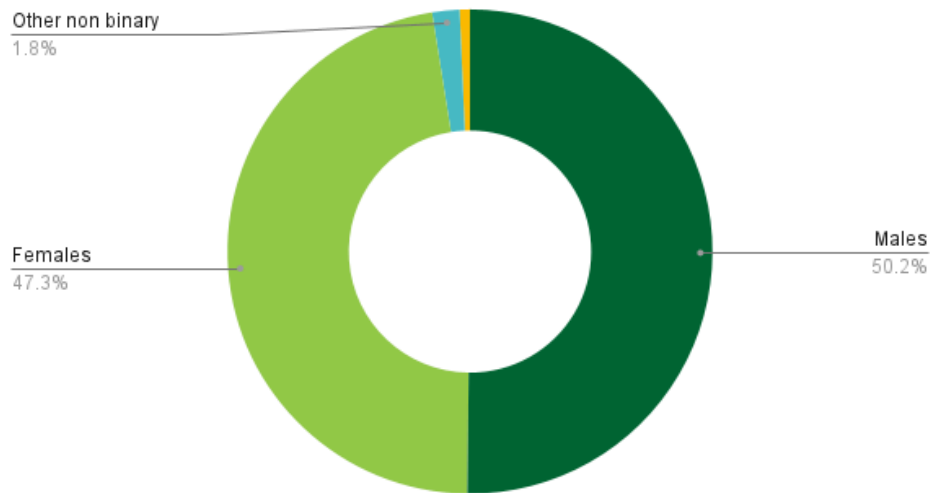
In terms of study level of IFSA members, 84.7% are bachelor students, while 13.3% are master students and only 2% of our members do the PhD. This information was not collected in the previous term, so we cannot compare the results but they would most likely be very similar.

The LC projects have exactly the same proportion between online (23.1%) and physical ones (76.9%) as the last term, but there is a visible increment of international events (6.8% in 2021/22, 13.3% in 2022/23).

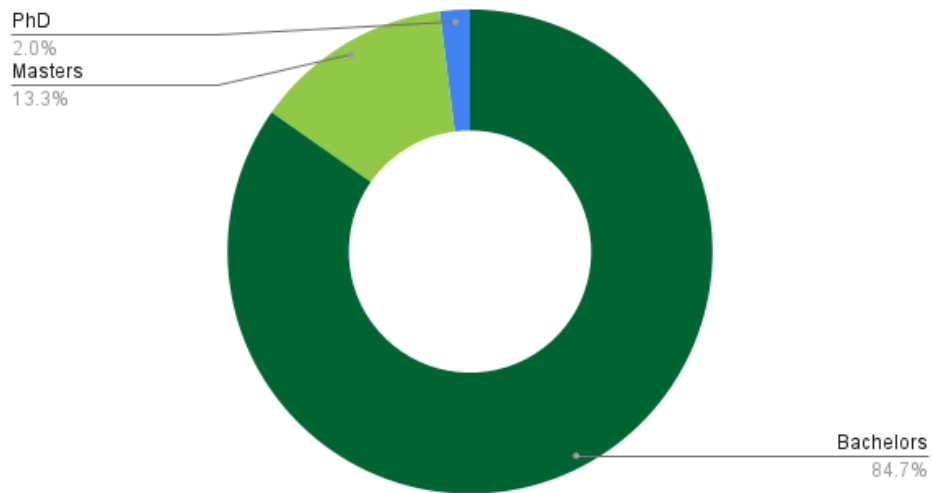

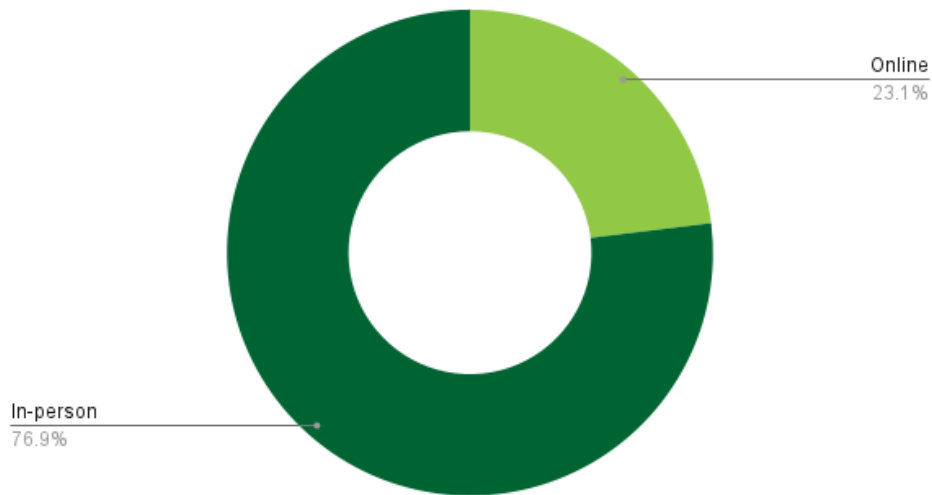
Gender distribution in IFSA 2022/2023



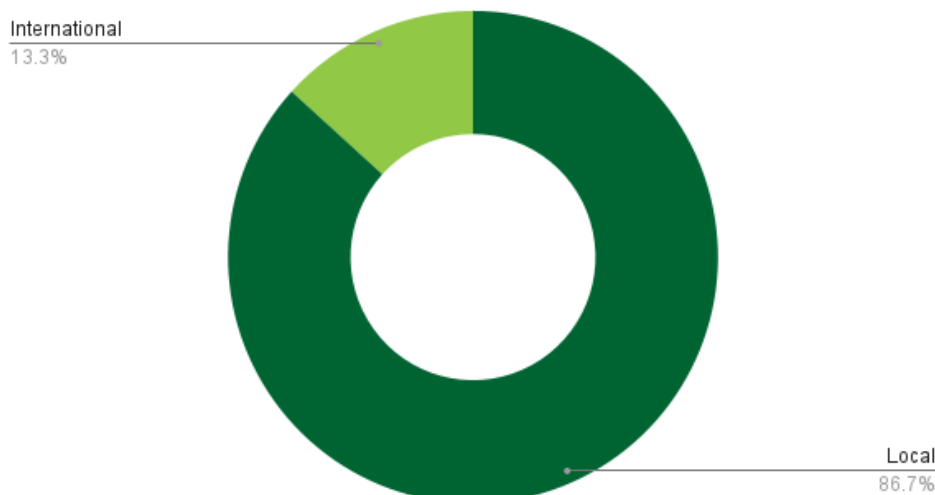
IFSA members according to study levels 2022/2023

Youth Forest Policy Days

The Youth Forest Policy Days (YFPD) was a collaborative three-day virtual event between IFSA and Forest Europe which was conducted from the 1st to 3rd of December 2022. The event aimed to advocate for forest education among young people and foster learning from experts and professionals from forestry and related fields.

Majority of the participants were young, comprising 95% of the total numbers while 60% were IFSA members. 35% of the event participants were from Europe, 29% from Asia, 28% from Africa, and only 8% from the Americas.

2023 International Day of Forests

Webinar Series

For the entire month of March, IFSA celebrated the 2023 International Day of Forests with the theme “Forests and Health” by conducting the first instalment of the Webinar Series.

Three episodes were done in collaboration with partners and alumni. The first episode titled “The Role of Forests in Carbon Sequestration” took place on the 11th of March 2023 with speakers Dr. Shalini Dhyani from IUCN and Prof. Jan Joseph Dida from the University of the Philippines Los Baños, with 32 participants who joined the session.

For the second episode, a panel discussion between Daniel Sánchez (Reforestamos, Latin America), Janalezza Esteban Thuaud (RECOFTC, Asia Pacific), and Dr. Marcus Lindner (EFI, Europe) took place on the 17th of March 2023 for the second episode titled “Local Carbon Policies as Pillars for Global Implementation”.

IFSA Strategy

The IFSA Strategy is a document describing the association's goals and concrete actions on how to achieve them. The first IFSA Strategy was launched in 2008 with a duration of 3 years. After the subsequent Strategies from 2011-2014, 2014-2018, 2018-2022, IFSA presented and published the latest Strategy at IFSS 2022 (<https://ifsa.net/documents/>). The current Strategy is divided into three different **Goals**:

- 1) Strengthen the IFSA Community
- 2) Take Learning Beyond the Classroom
- 3) Enable Students to Engage Globally

Each Goal is further defined by several **Sub-Goals** for which concrete activities are described in so-called **Action points**. To measure and monitor the implementation of the action points and to assess the impact, each action point is linked with at least one **Indicator** which is measured at the end of the term.

The term 2022/2023 marked the first term during which the numerous indicators stated in the IFSA Strategy were collected. To support the collection of indicators and ensure that all activities in IFSA work towards supporting the Strategy, a Strategy Work Plan was developed at the beginning of the term which linked all Commissions/Departments and their respective planned activities for the term to the specific Goals, Sub-Goals and Action points.
